- Filled in application along with a Portfolio (Evidence of previous two years i.e. 2022-23, 2023-24) covering all the criteria mentioned in the form to be submitted to the respective section HM on or before 02 November 2024 (softcopy as well as hardcopy).
- The filled Nomination Form along with the Portfolio of the students will be verified by the section HMs and will be submitted to the selection committee of the school.
- The selection committee of the school will select the three best candidates based on the parameters given by the organizers from each category and will send the nominations along with the recommendations to the organizers.
- At school level the decision of the Selection Committee will be final.

# Adult Category Terms and Criteria

### 2024-2025

**Our Vision**: A generation that is proud of its values and morals and represents them in reality

### Nomination Conditions:

- The nominated student shall be between 15 and 18 years old.
- The student shall be a citizen or resident of the State of Qatar.
- The nominated student's record shall be free of any school violations.
- The candidate shall not have previously won in the Buds or Adult categories.
- The school shall attach a certificate of recommendation from a committee that includes the school principal, one of the student's teachers, and a social worker, which may include the student's regular attendance at school, the student's adherence to school regulations and systems, the student's preservation of public property in the school, the student's commitment to the school uniform, and being a good moral role model in the school

#### **Competition Conditions:**

- First stage: To achieve the minimum to compete for the first three places (25 points out of the total evaluation points for the award).
- Second stage: The student who passed the first stage qualifies to present the presentation to the jury and the interview.
- The third stage: Successfully pass the interview.

#### Application conditions:

- Each school nominates one or two students only from the following category:
- Grades from ten to twelve

- Fill out the nomination form electronically with all the attachments required by the school only via the award website, and paper files or any other means are not accepted as this shall affect the student's evaluation.
- The school shall attach a certificate of recommendation from a committee that includes the school principal, one of the student's teachers, and the social specialist, and may include the student's regular attendance at school, the student's adherence to school regulations and systems, the student's preservation of public property in the school, the student's commitment to the school uniform, and his being a good moral role model in the school.
- The evidence and documents shall be clear and specific to reflect a true image of the candidate's actual performance, which may include letters of recommendation mentioning the good qualities that the student possesses and his maintaining his being a good moral role model in school, the classroom, and the home from one of the student's teachers, one of the student's colleagues, and the guardian.
- The evidence and documents in the student's file shall date back to the last two years, excluding the year of application.
- Ensure that all evidence and documents are certified, stamped and dated by the school administration.
- All attachments shall be numbered according to the standard number and in a sequential manner, ensuring that the numbers are not repeated.

- Unofficial documents and documents that do not have stamps, signatures or dates shall be excluded during the arbitration process.
- Community participation activities are approved by the implementing party, not by the school administration.
- The choice of language is left to the student in the interview, and Arabic is preferred.
- If the interview is online, the student is required to turn on the audio and video for ease of arbitration.
- All data is entered by the award coordinator responsible at the school only, taking into account that the required letters of recommendation are entered in complete confidentiality by the coordinator.
- The nomination period opens on September 1, 2024 via the AKHLAQUNA website <u>Home | AKHLAQUNA</u>
